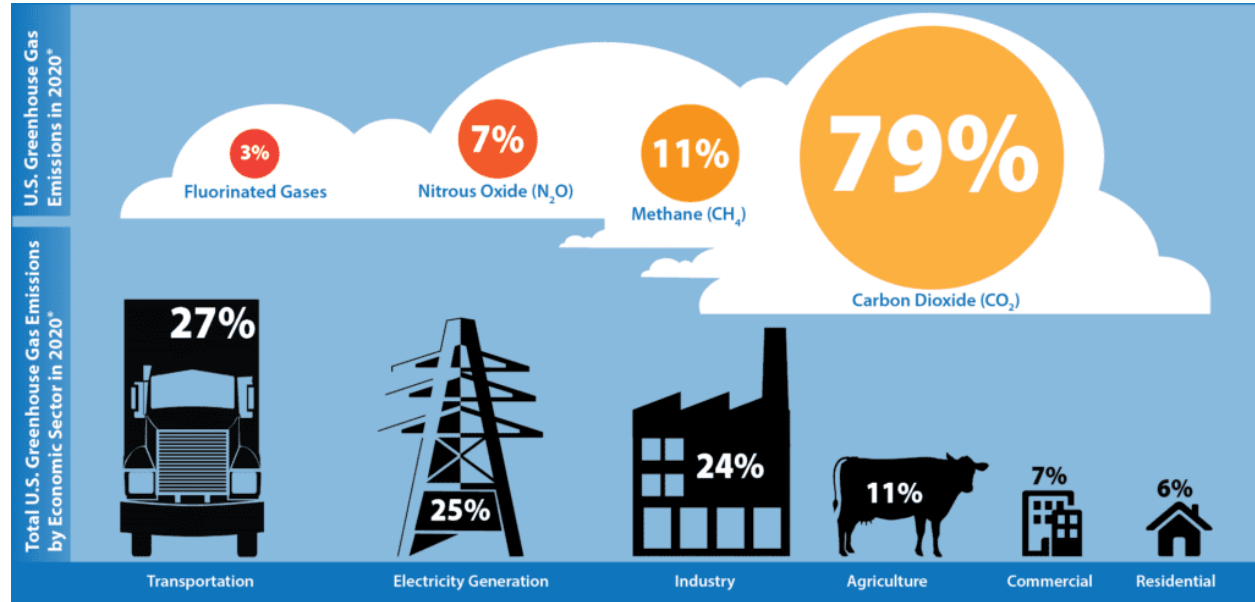

Eugene's Climate Goals

COMMUNITY CLIMATE RECOVERY ORDINANCE GOALS

Reduce Fossil Fuel Use

50% reduction by 2030 compared to 2010

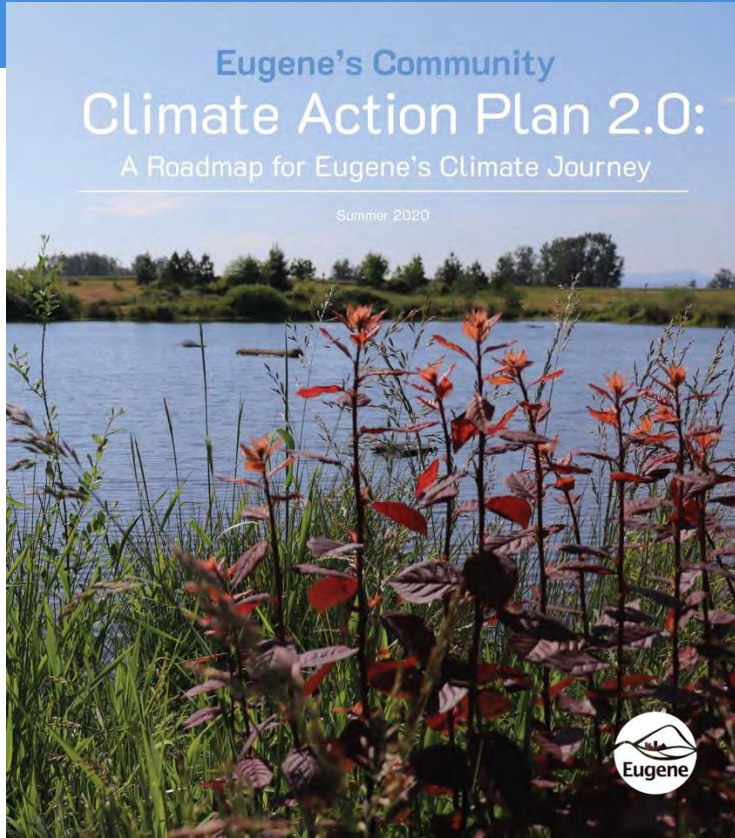


Reduce Community-wide GHG Emissions

Science-based goal to reduce ghgs to Eugene's average share of 350ppm by 2100



Climate Action Plan 2.0 (CAP2.0)

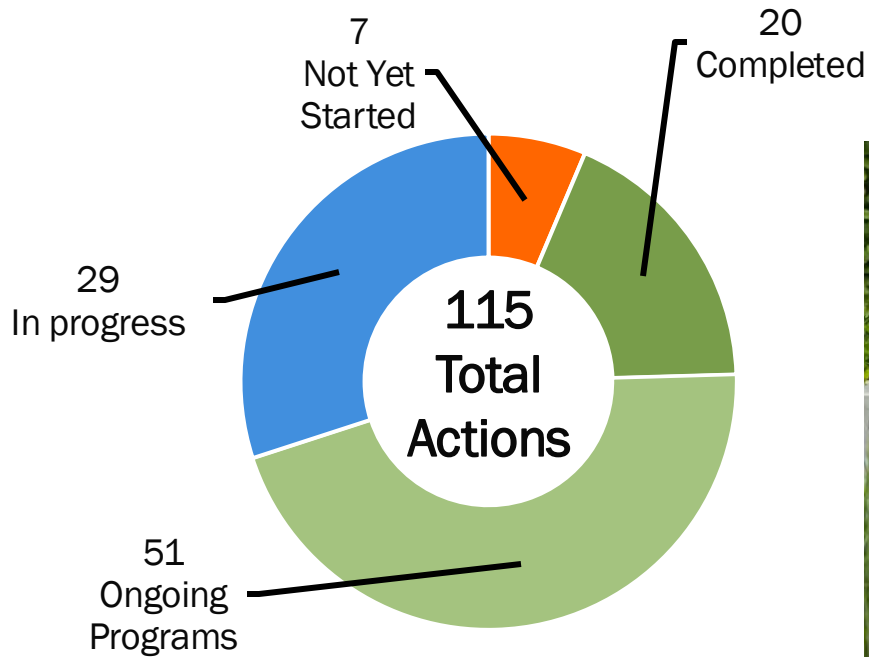


Reduce Eugene's fossil fuel use

Prepare our community to equitably adapt to climate change

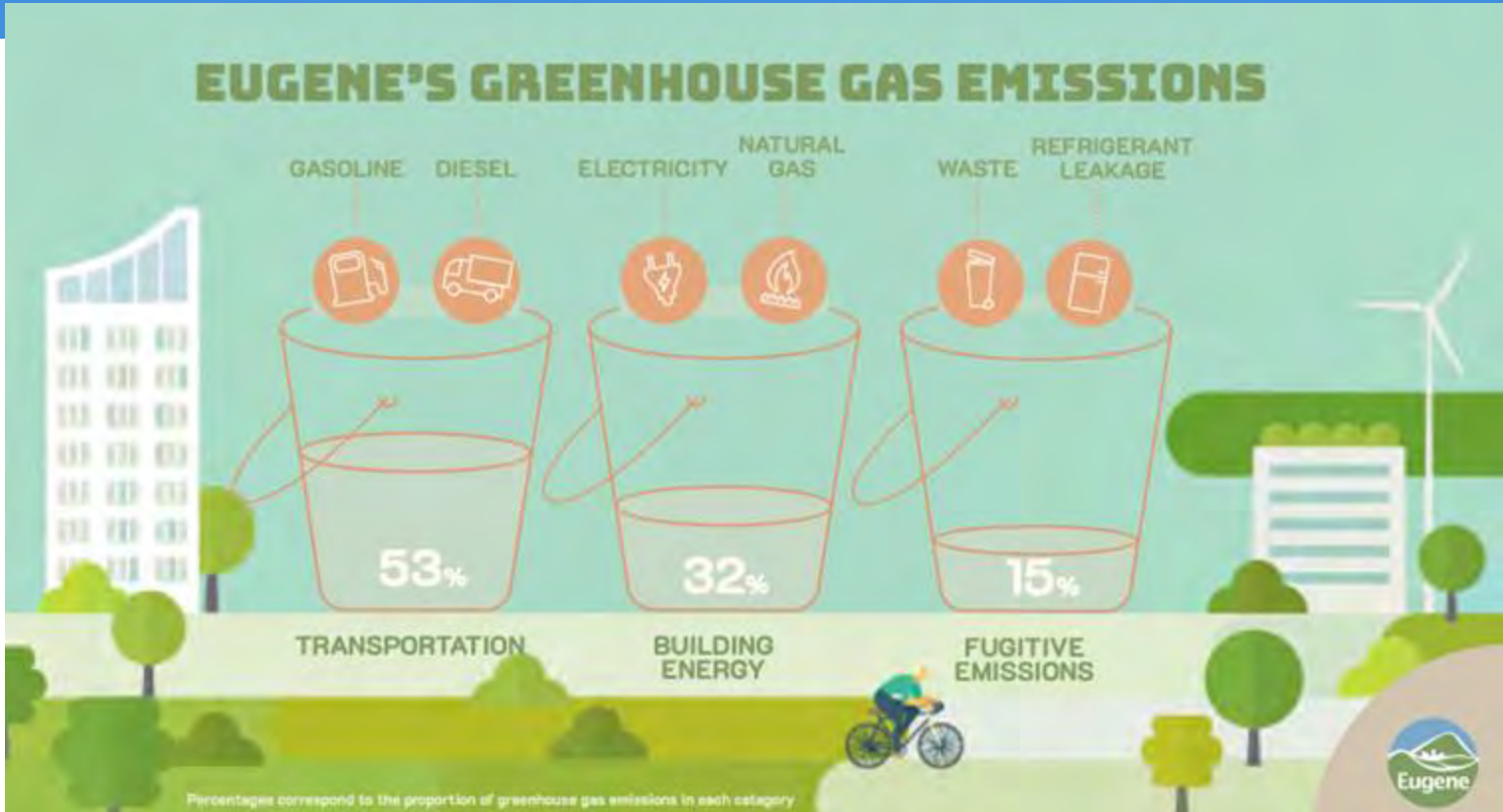
Climate Action Plan 2.0 (CAP2.0)



Eugene's CAP2.0 is 61% implemented.

Reducing Emissions from Transportation

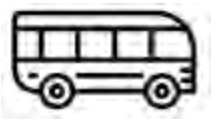


City efforts:

- Transportation System Plan, Envision Eugene, Electric Vehicle (EV) Strategy

What you can do:

- Try active transportation
- Consider an EV: incentives and EV carshare



Reducing Emissions from Buildings

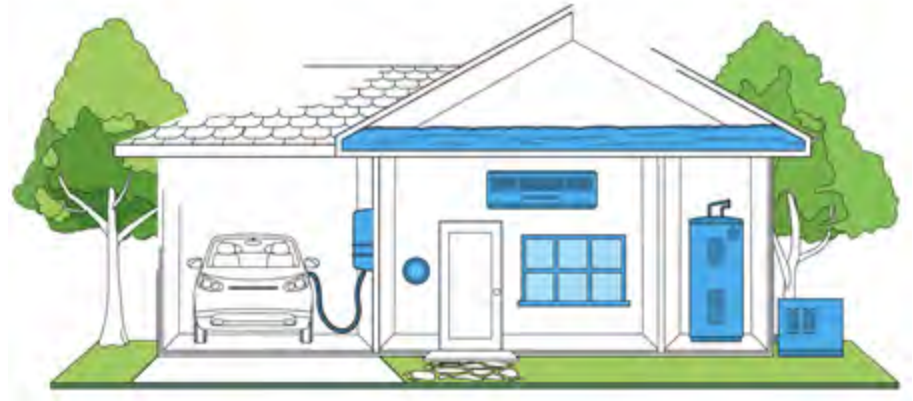


City efforts:

- Upgrading city facilities (e.g. Echo Hollow Pool)

What you can do:

- Home upgrades that reduce emissions
- Home Energy Score Program
- Incentives and rebates

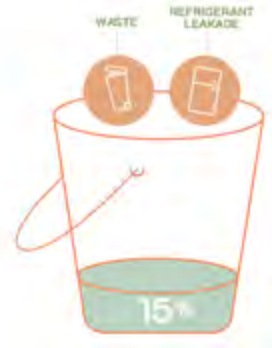

City efforts:

- Waste prevention program

What you can do:

- Buy second-hand
- Repair broken items
- Proper disposal (Lane County Waste Wise)
- Compost food scraps in yard debris bin



Love Food Not Waste Residential Food Scrap Collection Program



-  Plate Scrapings
-  Meat
-  Bones
-  Plant Trimmings
-  Dairy Products
-  Baked Goods
-  Kitchen Trimmings

**Nothing but food/plants in your yard debris bin:
No paper products, no compostable bags,
no compostable serviceware
(plates, cups, bowls, forks, spoons, etc.)**

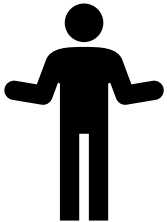
